FALL FIELD DAY 2018

Chris Ellsmere proudly led a tour through his thinned sugar bush – some members on foot, and some on bales of straw. John Quick was the management consultant he hired back in Summer 2016, and John explained all the steps that had been taken.

A comprehensive **Woodlot Inventory** sampled more than 5% of the sugar bush with a uniform pattern of plots, then John and Chris used the results to write a detailed list of **Landowner Objectives**.

A Registered Professional Forester read those two documents, then wrote a <u>Silvicultural</u> <u>Prescription For Tree Marking</u>. John and Theresa Parent used the Selection Silvicultural System to paint and tally the trees to be cut and sold in a Stand Improvement Thinning. They marked 150 Non-commercial "X" Trees (with no merchantable volume), 551 Commercial Firewood Trees (114 Cubic Cords), and only 314 Commercial Sawlog Trees (43,244 Board Feet).

They adopted a conservative approach of "Mark the worst first" to: remove trees with physical defects, improve the spacing between high quality Future Crop Trees, and upgrade the sugar bush's gene pool. Their painting decreased the percentage of White Ash from 5.19 to almost 0, lowered Red Oak from 5.92 to 3.69%, and increased the percentage of Sugar Maple from 73.32 to 80.99 ... all improvements in a commercial sugar bush. The Before Cut Basal Area of 26.4 square metres per hectare was reduced to 19.7, and that 25% reduction should not increase the odds of major wind damage by much. John and Theresa recommend investigating a second thinning in five or seven years to continue removing surplus trees and shaping the sugar bush's stand structure for sustainable yield.
