#### JACK O'HARA FORESTRY SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS Lillian McDaniel and Seamus Connor Scime

Trees are not just trees. Forestry is not just about trees. This theme underlies the studies and thinking of our two scholarship winners for 2022.



**Lillian McDaniel** 

Lillian McDaniel is in her fourth year of studies at Lakehead University in Thunder Bay, Ontario. Where she is in the Environmental Management program with a specialization in Wildlife Conservation and Management. She advises that these courses allow her to take an almost 50/50 split between wildlife focused and forestry based courses.

She advises that growing up she was always fascinated by wildlife. She hopes that her studies can give her the skills she will need to work managing wildlife in a forestry context in

Ontario. Her goal is to search for a position either with the Ministry of Natural Resources or a forestry authority.

She says that the biggest stressor throughout her university studies has been finances, and accordingly appreciates the help this scholarship provides.



Seamus Connor Scime

Seamus Connor Scime is in his second year in the Forestry Technician program at Sir Sandford Fleming College.

#### PRESENTATION BY BEN GWILLIAM

OBTAINING LIDAR DATA, ANALYZING THE IMAGES, AND HOW IT CAN BE ACCESSIBLE AND USEFUL FOR ALL OF US



Ben Gwilliam, our featured presenter

Ben Gwilliam is the Private Lands Inventory Analyst for the OWA and a recent graduate from the Masters of Forest Conservation Program at UofT.



His background is in computer science, GIS, and forestry and he currently leads the private lands inventory project working with LiDAR data to produce enhanced forest resources information across non-Crown lands in Ontario. This presentation showcased the use of advanced measurement and data gathering techniques being employed by the Ontario Woodlot Association to develop an enhanced private lands forest resource inventory over non-Crown land in the Province and how it will benefit landowners and forestry professionals.
