Harvesting activities started Thursday February 10<sup>th</sup>, on the first of the Co-Op properties in the Huronia Community Forest Co-Op.

On Tuesday February 15<sup>th</sup>, sunny and cold, Jack McFadden hosted a site visit to view the harvesting operations in action. Some of us had viewed the site before at the HWOA Fall Field.

## Request received to the Huronia Chapter members to fill out a confidential survey on Climate Change

#### In Memoriam Robert "Bob" Allan Ritchie

Bob passed away peacefully at his home in Elmvale Saturday, November 27, 2021 in his 80<sup>th</sup> year. Bob is survived by his wife Joanne and predeceased by his wife Clara Anne. Bob

is survived by four children, several grand and great grand children.

For those of us who knew Bob he was family first and a professional forest operator/ mill owner second, Ritchie Forest Products. Bob started the forest operations in 1984. Bob had a passion for cutting wood, conifer and a purpose to live the forest better than he found it. He lost his market for the harvested wood in 1987 and became a mill owner. The first mill was a portable mill in an open field covered with tarps. Over the next 35 years or so Bob built a very successful business. Bob never lost his passion for the woods, always had the interest of the forest in his operations, cared about his employees and supported education to many groups informing them of the importance of good forestry. Bob hosted a woodland owners' fall field day at the mill, provided tours of forest operations and the mill to several industry and organizations. government Ritchie Forest Products supported a Professional Forest Worker Student Field Day for many years. The field day was first held at Copeland Forest but was moved to a better location in Oro-Medonte, Ken Ewens property. Bob received the Huronia Woodland Owners' White Pine Award in 1996. Bob was recognized by Wildlife Canada, Forest Products Association of Canada and the Canadian Forest Service with a national Forest Stewardship Recognition Award for his educational contributions.
