FOREST HEALTH MEETING

Nathalie provided a general overview of the forest cover in Ontario and the extent of recent damaged caused by both natural events (storm damage) and invasive species (such as emerald ash bore and gypsy moths).



On June 25th, the HWOA held its first Forest Health meeting since 2019 at the Oro Station Community Hall. We had approximately 24 members attending and everyone enjoyed the opportunity to catch-up in person.

Many thanks to our newest director, Craig Drury, who graciously provided refreshments and cookies on a very warm afternoon.

Our presenter for the meeting was Nathalie Hevblom, a Forestry Advisor with Forests Ontario. Nathalie has a Zoology degree from the University of Guelph and a Master's degree in Forest Conservation from the University of Toronto. Upon completion of her work requirements. she became а Register Professional Forester. In addition to working part-time for Forest Ontario, she acts as a private woodlot consultant in the Bancroft area.



Director Chris Ellsmere presented Nathalie with a bottle of his very own maple syrup as a token of our appreciation.

She also provided us with some management ideas to deal with these issues, while acknowledging that those with larger properties must adapt. The best way to do that is through biodiversity. Replace that dead ash with a sugar maple. A variety of tree species is your best defense.

WILDERNESS FIRST AID TRAINING COURSE

The course is 2 days long (Sept 10th and 11th)

This First Aid Course is being held at the Quinte Conservation Authority Offices in Belleville, ON.

The course includes certification for:

- Standard first aid and CPR which is provided by the Emergency Care and Safety Institute and is recognized by Industry Canada to comply with National workplace safety standards and
- Wilderness First Aid Certification

The course is a great learning or refresher for standard first aid combined with remote first aid skills where 911 services are hours away.

The course normally costs \$235 if taken with CWMT but we are providing it to our members at a discounted price of \$169.50 (**before Aug 15**th - early bird pricing) or \$189.50 (**after August 15th**).
